The Program Delivery Council (“PDC”) is Medina Elementary forum for staff, administrators, and parents to directly collaborate on strategic, broad ranging issues affecting the education process and learning environment at Medina. The PDC is endorsed by the Bellevue School Board and Teacher’s Collective Bargaining Agreement, and with its unique purpose operates independently of all other boards and committees, with a general focus on academic initiatives spanning multiple academic years and supplementing those of the Board and administration.



Representative past PDC initiatives have included identifying issues and making recommendations for numerous academic enrichments such as: the technology specialist and resulting programs, the math specialist and resulting programs, curriculum enhancement committee, Science Week, etc.

The PDC has regular monthly meetings (as well as ad hoc meetings as necessary), and among other initiatives is working to expand our new literacy program – Journeys – with an associated technology curriculum.

The PDC is comprised of the school principal, a staff representative from each of three grade groups (K/1, 2/3, 4/5), a specialist rep, a classified staff rep, a PTA co-president, and four parent reps.
