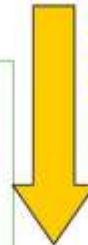

Test Fee is \$35 per student/per test. Scholarships are available for Bellevue High students who qualify for Free and Reduced lunch. See your counselor to sign the registration form prior to submitting. Testing will begin promptly at 9:00am, so please arrive at 8:30am for check-in. Students need to bring several number two pencils and a calculator. NO extra calculators will be available onsite at the tests. It is also suggested to bring a water bottle and light snack.

IMPORTANT: Pre-registration is REQUIRED by Tuesday, May 15th for the ACT Practice Test; Tuesday May 22nd. Registration forms are available to download at BHS main school or PTSA websites (www.bsd405.org/bhs/ and www.bellevuehighptsa.com) along with hard copies located in the Counseling Office.
