### **Navigating the Sea of Information at Newport**

I wish I could tell you there was a single resource for all the information families need at Newport. The next best thing is the following guide to information for families.

- Our **website** contains most of the information you will need or a link to it:
  - Use the [Knights](#) tab for athletics and activities,
  - Use the [Counseling](#) tab for registration, career, and college information and support, and
  - Use the [Resources](#) tab for bulletins, calendars, bell schedules, forms, lunch, fees and more.
  - Link to the [Newport online calendar](#) to follow daily events and college visit schedules.
  - Use [Naviance](#) for all things college prep. Your student has an ID and password that is intended for families as well. Share the access information and explore together.

- **Ask your students.** I know they can resist, but as a parent and an educator, I highly recommend persisting. Your interest will help them as much as the information will help you.
- **Ask other parents**, especially those with older students. Use the upcoming Ski Swap as an informal opportunity to meet your parent community. These unofficial yet priceless resources can help you with both information and the wisdom of experience. These discussions help parents understand just how unique each student's experience can be and how flexible we (our school and your family) must be to help them thrive in their individual way.
- **OneNote** functions primarily as a student-teacher resource. It can give you insight into the curriculum and course work, but it's mainly a teaching tool that helps prepare students for the digital world that awaits them in college and career.
- **Synergy** gives parents access to course progress, assignment completion, and other confidential and student-specific information.
- I strongly suggest that you subscribe to the **Daily Bulletin** and skim through it once or twice each week. It carries up-to-date announcements and reminders. In particular the Daily Bulletin follows clubs and activities more closely than any other resource. - **Find Newport Television (NTV)** on the web for in depth stories and features produced by students. You'll catch a glimpse into student life as well as gather useful information.
