City to offer child care resources if teachers strike

BELLEVUE – If Bellevue School District teachers vote to strike, the city will support the Boys and Girls Clubs of Bellevue’s expanded childcare day camp on Sept. 2 at South Bellevue Community Center.

The city is also prepared to open day camps for children at two other community centers on Thursday, Sept. 4, if the strike continues.

Details:

- The Boys and Girls Clubs of Bellevue’s expanded day camp will be open at South Bellevue Community Center, 14509 SE Newport Way, for elementary-age children starting Tuesday, Sept. 2, 7:30 a.m. to 6 p.m. The cost will be \$40 per day (\$20 if already enrolled in Project Learn Afterschool program). Campers will need to bring their own lunch, but snacks will be provided. For registration information, call 425-452-4240.
- If needed, day camps will also be provided at two other city community centers for children ages 5-12 starting Sept. 4, 7:30 a.m. to 5:30 p.m.. The cost will be \$40 per day; scholarships will be available. Campers will need to bring their own lunch, but snacks will be provided. Space is limited and camps will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis. Registration will be required and information will be available on the city’s website, or by phone at 452-452-6885.

Additional city support and response will be evaluated based on the longevity of the strike and available resources. For more information, call 452-452-6885.
